




CAMRA Mission


What is Real Ale?

- Beer that is "brewed from traditional ingredients, matured by secondary fermentation in the container from which it is dispensed, and served without the use of extraneous carbon dioxide".
- Sometimes called cask conditioned beer
- Served at cellar temps (mid 50s)
- Low carbonation (1 volume or less)
- Typically in the range of 3% to 5% ABV (not a requirement)
- Can be bottled








Beer Engine
